ABOUT NTSE

No TALENT SEARCH EXAM equals the National Talent Search Exam conducted by NCERT, the most prestigious and competitive for class VIII students. Its predecessor National Science Talent Search Scheme (NSTSS) was established in the year 1963 and was specifically aimed at identifying talented students and awarding scholarships to them for higher studies.

The scholarships under the present scheme are awarded for studies up to doctoral level in Sciences and Social Sciences and up to second-degree level in professional courses like medicine and engineering.

No serious student in class VIII can afford to miss this once-in-a-life time opportunity to be recognized among the top one thousand scholars in the nation.

STAGES

Identification of talent is a two-stage selection process. While the individual state/UT conducts the first stage selection, the second stage selection at the national level is carried out by the NCERT.

The State Level Talent Search examination is conducted on the second Sunday of November, the result of which is declared in January/February.

Only the candidates selected by the states/UTs are eligible to appear in the National Level examination conducted by the NCERT on the 2nd Sunday of May every year.

Based on merit, a stipulated number of candidates are called for interviews, usually held in July/August.

ELIGIBILITY

All students studying in Class VIII in any recognized school are eligible to appear at the State Level Examination from the state in which the school is located.

SYLLABUS

The syllabus for NTSE is broadly equivalent to the syllabi followed in Classes 7 & 8 of NCERT & STATE curricula. However, the syllabus is only a broad guideline. Questions and problems in Talent Search exams are usually non-conventional and of high difficulty level.

The written examination consists of

- Part-I: MAT (Mental Ability Test)
- Part-II: SAT (Scholastic Ability Test)

In SAT, there are a total of 90 items - 35 for Science, 20 for Mathematics and 35 for Social Science. However, these are not divided into separate sections.

MAT section has 90 questions that evaluate the candidate's ability to logically infer from the given information. Various question types covered are Number Series, Letter Series, Non-Verbal Reasoning, Classification, Analogies.

The most appropriate time to start NTSE preparation is in Class VI. Act Now.
